Canadian filmmaker Sarah Abbott's intimate engagement with four Cape Town residents reveals the irony that many people who dedicated themselves to the fight for human dignity still struggle for daily survival ten years after South Africa's first all-race elections. For over a decade, Sarah's work has been screened at international film festivals, won awards and supported by various granting agencies. She is currently an assistant professor in film production at The University of Regina.
